What NOT to Bring

- **Mobile Phones, Radios, iPods/mp3 Players, Tablets, Games, Smart Watches or other Electronic Devices** will be confiscated until departure time at Camp's end. (Film/digital cameras & plain wristwatches are acceptable.)
- Cameras are encouraged but **NO mobile phone cameras** are allowed
- Absolutely **NO alcohol, drugs, or tobacco** possession or use is allowed at Camp
